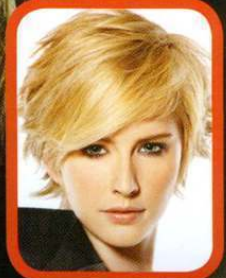
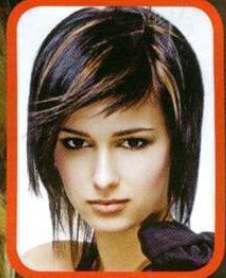

Looking for an almost instant update? Nothing works quite like color! Nicholas Penna, Jr., owner and lead stylist at SalonCapri in Newton & Dedham, MA, tells you how to achieve the season's freshest looks.

CONTRAST RATIO >>

THE LOOK: Baby-blond-tipped brunette

WHO CAN WEAR IT: According to Penna, "This is a good choice for someone who is looking for bolder highlights and lots of contrast." It suits lighter skin tones, but can also work for darker complexions.

HOW TO GET IT: Thick sections are spiked up and highlights are painted on using the balayage technique. The darker shade below is her natural color.

<< COPPER TOP

THE LOOK: Deep brown with copper threads throughout the fringe

WHO CAN WEAR IT: Penna says that this shade will suit most any skin tone or eye color. Do keep in mind that it's ultra-edgy, so if you don't want to turn heads, try a more traditional brunette.

HOW TO GET IT: The color is applied from roots to ends, then balayage is used to lighten up the bang area.

RED ALERT >>

THE LOOK: Vibrant copper red
WHO CAN WEAR IT: This is a great look for anyone with pale skin and light eyes, says Penna, and for the outgoing woman who wants to create a sexy, flirty effect.

HOW TO GET IT: Use a single process red, then have a darker version of the hue painted onto the ends.

<< BLONDE AMBITION

THE LOOK: Platinum double process blonde on top, with soft brunette along the sides

WHO CAN WEAR IT: Women with fair skin, lighter eyes and a bold personality can rock this shade. However, it doesn't work well next to olive complexions.

HOW TO GET IT: Your colorist will need to bleach, then tone over your color with a super-pale platinum.

THINK PINK

THE LOOK: Dirty blonde with pink highlights

WHO CAN WEAR IT:

While this shade will suit all skin tones and eye colors, you need a hip, edgy personality to totally pull it off.

HOW TO GET IT:

Heavily highlighted blonde is enhanced with pink tones on top.

THE LOOK: Honey blonde

WHO CAN WEAR IT: Anyone with light skin and eye color and a bold sense of style can give this look a try.

HOW TO GET IT: Penna reports that you can achieve this hue with a single process, high lift blonde. HAIR & MAKEUP BY JEAN CLAUDE BIGUINE, PARIS.

HOT HIGHLIGHTS

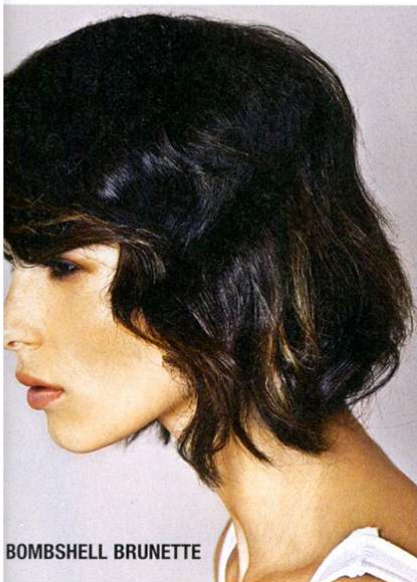
THE LOOK: Reddish brown with light highlights

WHO CAN WEAR IT: If you have hazel eyes and an olive complexion, this shade will look stunning. However, if you have ultra-pale skin, Penna warns that it might make you look too pink.

THE LOOK: Red that moves forward from darker to bright orange tones

WHO CAN WEAR IT: Designed for young, flirty, fun types, it complements a variety of skin tones. Keep in mind, though, that red fades quickly so it can be high maintenance.

HOW TO GET IT: Panels are created through the front and sides, and color is painted on from mid-shaft to ends. HAIR BY INTERCOIFFURE FRANCE.

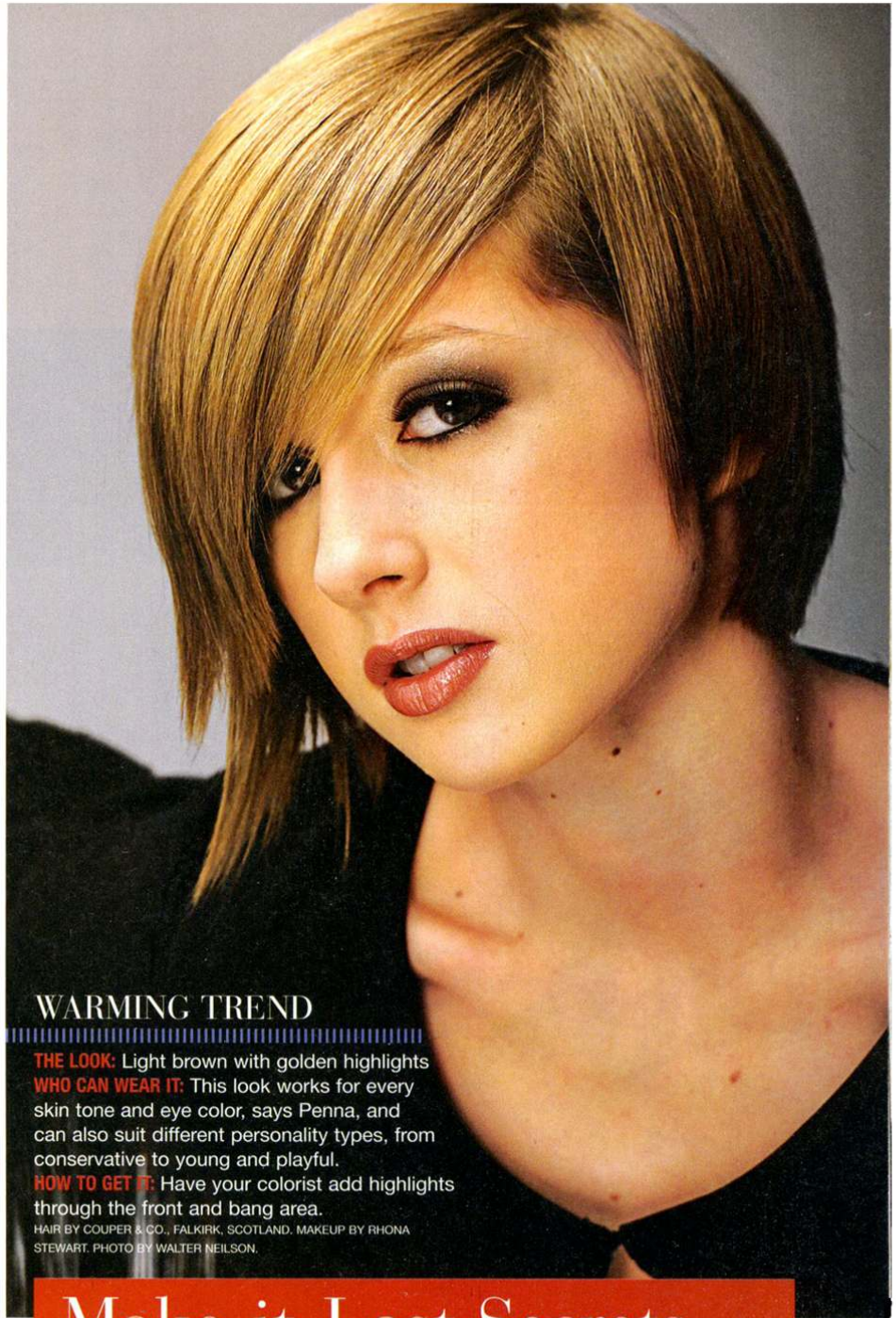
BOMBSHELL BRUNETTE

THE LOOK: Walnut brown

WHO CAN WEAR IT: This very wearable color suits many personality types and a variety of skin tones. Golden highlights through the front and ends add warmth, but won't inhibit easy grow-out.

HOW TO GET IT: This look can be achieved with single process color, followed by balayage.

WARMING TREND

THE LOOK: Light brown with golden highlights

WHO CAN WEAR IT: This look works for every skin tone and eye color, says Penna, and can also suit different personality types, from conservative to young and playful.

HOW TO GET IT: Have your colorist add highlights through the front and bang area.

Make-it-Last Secrets

Now that you've got the shade, Penna tells you how to keep it fresh.

1. "Invest in a good shampoo that's designed to treat color-treated hair," says Penna. "It will be more costly than your average over-the-counter product, but it will help to condition your locks and save the color."
2. After salon color, stick around for a glossifying treatment. "This will lock in the color, add shine and give you an extra week between appointments."
3. As an alternative to gloss, have a conditioning treatment when hair is colored. "It will add shine, seal the hair cuticle and lock in moisture," says Penna.
4. If you go swimming, prep hair by dampening it, then applying regular conditioner. Brush through and leave in for an added layer of protection from pool or ocean water.
